



ALAN D. VERA

Alan previously worked as Brand Manager for Proctor & Gamble which prepared him for the next chapter of his life — cleaning up and eliminating excessive packaging and waste in the plastics industry, including recycling. While Vice President of McCann-Erickson in Houston, Alan teamed up with current Acme Fish Creative partners to develop marketing/advertising programs for Texas Instruments and Six Flags.

Quest grew into one of the most highly regarded marketing and communications organizations in the U.S. under Alan's leadership, serving Exxon, FedEx, 3M, Mitsubishi, Dow, DuPont, BP, Shell, International Paper, Baker Hughes, Schlumberger, ConAgra, HP and many other Fortune 500 firms. they diligently work to make Texas a strong and better place to live.

On March 23, 2022, Alan and Colleen received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Harris County Republican Party for their work on Election Integrity. Alan and Colleen received the Christian Patriots Award for their work on Election Integrity on April 2, 2022.

GUN CONTROL LEGISLATION PASSES WITH REPUBLICAN HELP

What Democrats call the most significant gun legislation in decades passed the Senate June 23rd with the help of a coalition of Republicans led by — **YES!!!** — **Texas Senator John Cornyn**. The 65-33 vote occurred after a month of negotiations following the school shooting in Uvalde.

The legislation includes \$15 billion in funding. It is intended to help states put in place and enforce extreme risk protection orders, also known as Red Flag laws. Such laws are meant to keep dangerous people from having guns, closing

loopholes and expanding background checks. The juvenile and mental health record for those under 21 may now be accessed under the new law. However, the enhanced background checks for younger buyers will expire after a decade. More than half of the \$15 billion in funds are allocated to improve school safety and fund mental health programs. And there are stronger penalties for straw purchases (the buying of a gun for someone else) as well as for gun trafficking.

The Democrat majority in the House made the pathway to law a virtual certainty. The bill was signed into law by the President on June 25. Senator Cornyn was quoted as saying, "Doing nothing is an abdication of our responsibility." Republicans had to agree to some things in the legislation "that were outside our comfort zone that, frankly, we are having to explain to people." Cornyn claimed that the potential to save lives "is worth any sort of concession we might have had to make during negotiations."


Prior stumbling blocks were overcome when the Democrats gave up their calls for banning assault weapons or raising the age to purchase a rifle to 21. Republicans agreed to tighten scrutiny of young gun owners.

Those Republican Senators voting for the final bill were: Senators Mitt Romney (Utah), Thom Tillis (North Carolina), Roy Blunt (Missouri), Richard Burr (North Carolina), Bill Cassidy (Louisiana), Susan Collins (Maine), Mitch McConnell (Tennessee), Shelley Moore Capito (West Virginia), Joni Ernst (Iowa), Lisa Murkowski (Alaska), Todd Young (Indiana), Rob Portman (Ohio), Patrick Toomey (Pennsylvania), John Cornyn (Texas) and Lindsey Graham (South Carolina).

Then, on Wednesday, July 20, the House Judiciary Committee approved the Assault Weapons Ban of 2021 in a 25-18 vote following an hour's-long markup. Sponsored by Rep. David Cicilline (D-Rhode Island), the bill seeks to prohibit the sale, manufacture, transfer or import of different types of semi-automatic weapons. Committee Chair Rep. Jerrold Nadler (D-NY) said he is looking forward to "moving this legislation . . . onto the House floor," but House leadership has not yet announced a vote.

Note: GTRW submitted letters in support of the Second Amendment to all Texas members of Congress and our two Senators, Cornyn and Cruz, prior to passage of the final legislation.

Congratulations, Ladies, on significantly increasing the number of hours worked for GTRW in the Second Quarter of this year! Our GTRW members reported **35,703 hours!** That is **14,018 more hours** reported by GTRW than in our First Quarter and definitely an improvement over previous numbers! We endeavor to keep GTRW members informed of all campaign needs and activities, *so if you're aware of any in the coming months, please let me know so we can spread the word!*

Please remember that *everything* you do for Golden Triangle Republican Women or the Republican Party and our candidates counts! That includes:

- Travel Time to and from meetings/events;

thought of providing books to these children to help them deal with their situation. Mr. Mullins is compiling a list of recommended books for us, most of which can be ordered from Amazon. We hope to complete our efforts on behalf of Buckner's and the foster care children they serve in the fall of 2022.

July 2022 Update: On June 8, GTRW's Literacy Committee met with Dr. Shannon Allen, Superintendent of Beaumont Independent School District, and JCRP Chair Joe Evans, who is a member of BISD's Board. Dr. Allen was very interested in our ideas about providing dictionaries for disadvantaged third-grade students and mentioned that all third-grade students and their families could benefit from having a dictionary in the home.

Soon thereafter, we ordered 96 copies of what Webster's calls their "Best-Selling Dictionary for Students." *Webster's Dictionary for Students/Special Encyclopedic Edition* is written for use by third-grade through sixth-grade students and features special sections for homework help including world maps, branches of government, U.S. Presidents and American History.

These 96 dictionaries are ready for distribution and include labels designed, printed and placed by GTRW's Literacy Committee on each owner's page which read:

PAGE 16 WHY & WHO WE HONOR ON MEMORIAL DAY GTRW GAZETTE

Memorial Day is a very important National Holiday. It is the day we honor those who <u>died</u> in active military service throughout United States history. It is observed on the last Monday of May of every year and is not to be confused with Veterans' Day, which celebrates the service of United States military men *veterans* who served in previous wars and



veterans who served in previous wars and are still living.

Recognition of Memorial Day as a large observance began three years after the Civil War in 1868, when the head of an organization of Union veterans established "*Decoration Day*" as a time for the nation to *decorate with flowers* the graves of those who had died in service. Major General John A. Logan



declared it should be May 30, believed to have been chosen because flowers would be blooming across the country.

General Logan's order for his posts to decorate graves in 1868 "with the choicest flowers of springtime" urged: "We should guard their graves with sacred vigilance . . . Let pleasant paths invite the coming and going of reverent visitors and fond mourners. Let no neglect, no ravages of time, testify to the



present or to the coming generations that we have forgotten as a people the cost of a free and undivided republic."

On that first Memorial Day, May 30, 1868, ceremonies were held at Arlington National Cemetery, across the Potomac River from Washington, D.C., where approximately 5,000 people attended. Then, as now, small American flags were placed on each grave.



Ceremonies that day in 1868 also centered around the mourning-draped veranda of the Arlington mansion, once the home of General Robert E. Lee. Various Washington officials, including General and Mrs. Ulysses S. Grant, presided; and following the speeches, children from the Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphan Home and members of the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) made their way through the cemetery, strewing flowers on both Union and Confederate graves, reciting prayers and singing hymns.

By the end of the 19th century, Memorial Day ceremonies were being held on May 30 throughout the nation. State legislatures passed proclamations designating the day, and the Army and Navy adopted regulations for proper observance at their facilities. However, it was not until after World War I that the day was expanded to honor those who have died in all American wars.

Fast forward to Memorial Day, May 30, 1922, where it is probably no coincidence that the completed Lincoln Memorial, whose cornerstone was set in 1915, was dedicated before a gathering of more than 50,000 people, black and white. Lincoln's only surviving son, Robert Todd Lincoln, attended the ceremony.

President Warren G. Harding and former President/ then Chief Justice of the Supreme Court William Howard Taft delivered addresses.

Memorial Day was finally declared a national holiday by Congress in 1971 and was then designated as the last Monday in May, which in 2022 is the 30th of May!

How many soldiers do we memorialize each year on Memorial Day? FAR TOO MANY gave the ultimate sacrifice. Let us enumerate some of our nation's wars:

- 1 French & Indian War 1756-1763
- 2 American Revolutionary War 1775-1783
- 3 War of 1812
- 4 Civil War 1861-1865
- 5 Spanish-American War 1898
- 6 World War I 1917-1918
- 7 World War II 1941-1945
- 8 Korean War 1950-1953
- 9 Vietnam War 1962-1973
- 10 Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm 1990-1992

11 - Global War on Terrorism/Operation Enduring Freedom (Afghanistan)

- 2001-2021
- 12 Operation Iraqi Freedom 2003-2011
- 13 Multiple operations and conflicts today

Yes, too many gave too much!

Words cannot express the debt we owe these men and women. Our entire nation owes our freedom to these fallen heroes. We ARE the *Land of the Free* BECAUSE of soldiers.

On Memorial Day, Fellow Patriots, let us pay respect to those who didn't make it home. We cannot forget that freedom is NEVER free! Someone always pays the ultimate price.

This year, AND EVERY YEAR, please encourage your families — particularly our children — to actively participate in *honoring our fallen on Memorial Day, May 30*.

VOLUME 14, 2ND QUARTER AMERICANISM - FLAG DAY IS JUNE 14

On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress, seeking to promote national pride and unity, passed the first Flag Resolution, officially adopting the Stars and Stripes as our national flag. The resolution states:

Resolved: That the Flag of the United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the Union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation.

Because of this resolution, June 14th is celebrated as FLAG DAY. Although Congress did not dictate why red, white and blue were chosen for the flag, Secretary of the Continental Congress Charles Thompson wrote a detailed summary of work done in creating a National Seal, which states:

The colors ... are those used in the flag of the United States of America: White signifies purity and innocence, Red, hardiness & valour, and Blue . . . signifies vigilance, perseverance & justice.

In the late 1800s, schools all over the United States held Flag Day programs to contribute to the Americanization of immigrant children, and the observance caught on with individual communities.

In 1916, 139 years after the Continental Congress proclamation, President Woodrow Wilson marked the anniversary of that decree by officially establishing June 14 as a nationwide observance of Flag Day. Since then, Americans have commemorated the adoption of the Stars and Stripes in many ways — displaying the flag in the front of their homes, parades and other patriotic observances.

On August 3, 1949, President Harry Truman officially declared June 14 of each year as National FLAG DAY. The legislation called upon the president to issue a FLAG DAY proclamation every year, so it is not a federal holiday.

While the U.S. government has encouraged citizens to display Old Glory outside of our homes and businesses, we need to "lead the pack" in celebrating FLAG DAY!

So, here are a few interesting facts for you to share about Old Glory:

1 - Some historians believe Betsy Ross (Elizabeth Griscom Ross), an upholsterer who repaired tents and uniforms during the Revolutionary War, sewed and helped design the Stars and Stripes. She often told her children and friends of the visit in May 1776, when three members of a secret committee from the Continental Congress came to call upon her. Those representatives, George Washington, Robert Morris and George Ross, asked her to sew the first flag. George Washington was then head of the Continental Army. Betsy knew George Ross as she had married his nephew and Robert Morris was perhaps the wealthiest citizen in the Colonies. Betsy was well acquainted

with the great General Washington — her pew at church was next to that of George and Martha Washington. Betsy's daughter recalled that "Washington had often been in her house in friendly visits, as well as on business; that she had embroidered ruffles for his shirt bosoms and cuffs, and that it was partly owing to his friendship for her that she was chosen to make the flag."

According to Betsy, General Washington showed her a rough design of the flag that included a six-pointed star. But Betsy demonstrated how to cut a five-pointed star in a single snip and got the nod. According to her sequence of events, she finished the flag in either late May or early June 1776. In July, the Declaration of Independence was read aloud for the first time at Independence Hall, heralding the birth of a new nation.

2 - In 1958, news of Alaska becoming a state had spread. Designers began reconfiguring the flag to insert a 49th star and a 17-year-old Ohio high school student named Bob Heft came up with a different idea. Using his mother's sewing machine, he reconstructed his family's 48-star flag by patterning 50 stars upon his newly designed flag. Bob turned it in as a history class project, telling his teacher he thought Hawaii would achieve statehood, too, but he received a B-minus for his grade!

Thereafter, Bob sent his flag to his congressman, who submitted it to then President Eisenhower. After Alaska and Hawaii were admitted as states, he received a call at work one day — from President Eisenhower. He was invited to Washington and, on July 4, 1960, Bob Heft stood beside President Eisenhower as the 50-star flag was raised for the first time.

3 - Another interesting fact about Old Glory is that draping a coffin with the American Flag is not reserved for military men, veterans and U.S. government officials. Anyone may utilize this tradition to honor those who have passed on!

Senator Ted Cruz and U.S. Rep. Randy Weber Introduce Bill to Boost School Safety

WASHINGTON, D.C. - U.S. Sen. Ted Cruz (R-Texas) introduced legislation to enhance school safety and prevent school-based violence. Sen. Cruz's bill is the Senate companion to legislation introduced by U.S. Rep. Randy Weber (R-Texas). The Cruz-Weber legislation would allow schools to use unspent previously appropriated Federal COVID-19 education-related funding to improve school security. This bill is cosponsored by Sen. Lankford (R-Okla.).

About the "Protect Our Children's Schools Act," Sen. Cruz said:

"Far too many atrocities have been committed at schools in Texas and across our nation. Increasing school safety is of paramount importance. The excess and unused monies given to schools to address the coronavirus should be used to keep our kids safe from monsters in their communities, and our bill would make sure local schools can use these funds to address their specific security needs. It's teachers and local education officials who know best what their schools need, and how to use funds to keep our kids safe when they go to school."

Rep. Weber said:

"My district knows too well that evil people do evil things, and we know the importance of protecting our children in schools. As we approach a new school year, our children should feel safe and secure when they walk through the doors, and that's why I introduced a common-sense bill to harden schools. I appreciate Senator Cruz introducing the Senate version of the Protect Our Children's Schools Act."

Ronald Reagan on GUN CONTROL

I don't believe that taking guns away from honest people is going to keep the criminals from getting them. There probably are no stricter gun controls in the world than those in Washington, D.C. There are over 20,000 gun-control laws in the United States today. But the fellow that decided to use me for target practice a year ago last March – there he was on the street at 2 o'clock in the afternoon in spite of all those laws against it, and he had a gun.

It's a nasty truth, but those who seek to inflict harm are not fazed by gun control laws. I happen to know this from personal experience.

The Constitution does not say that government shall decree the right to keep and bear arms. The Constitution says, "... the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed."

We've both heard the charge that supporting gun owners rights encourages a violent, shoot-em-up society. But just a minute. Don't they understand that most violent crimes are not committed by decent, law-abiding citizens? They're committed by career criminals. Guns don't make criminals. Hard-core criminals use guns. And locking them up, the hard-core criminals up, and throwing away the key is the best gun-control law we could ever have.


