Weber built his air conditioning company, Weber's Air & Heat, in 1981 from scratch and

While serving in the Texas House, Randy Weber authored landmark legislation to combat human trafficking and protect women, young girls, and boys - some as young as 12 years old.

Weber has lived in a 20-mile radius all his life and has been married to Brenda Weber, a retired schoolteacher, for over 45 years. He is a graduate of Alvin Community College, and holds a Bachelor of Science from the University of Houston at Clear Lake. Randy and Brenda have three children and eight wonderful grandchildren. He previously served on the House Foreign Affairs and Transportation and Infrastructure Committee.

Representative Dade Phelan (Beaumont) is the 76th Speaker of the Texas House and is currently serving his fourth term as State Representative for District 21.

Prior to serving as Speaker, he served as Chair of the House Committee on State Affairs, as Vice -Chair of the Natural Resources Committee, as a member of the Calendars, Appropriations, and Elections Committees as well as the Select Committee on Ports, Innovation and Infrastructure.

In 2019, Speaker Phelan was named by "Texas Monthly" as one of the Best Legislators of the 86th legislative session. He has earned numerous additional accolades in recognition of his legislative service, including Capitol Inside's "Most Valuable Sophomore Member" in 2017 and as one of their "Most Outstanding Freshmen Legislators" in 2015.

Phelan has been named Legislative Champion by the Boys and Girls Club of Texas, Legislator of the Year by the Texas Apartment Association, Guardian of Small Business by the National Federation of Independent Business, Most Valuable Legislator by the Texas Association of Community Schools, a Fighter for Free Enterprise by the Texas Association of Business and the 2019 Mental Health Champion by Mental Health America.

Phelan is the former president and two-time Governor appointee to the Lower Neches Valley Authority. His board service includes the Texas Lyceum, Southeast Texas CASA, Golden Triangle Coastal Conservation Association, The Jefferson Theater, St. Anne Catholic Church and Catholic Charities of Southeast Texas.

In addition to his duties as Speaker, Phelan works as a real estate developer at his family's fourth generation commercial real estate development firm, which owns and manages retail, industrial and office property in Texas and Arkansas.

His wife, Kim, is a solo practitioner attorney and together they have four sons, Ford, Mack, Hank and Luke. He and his family reside together in Southeast Texas, where Speaker Phelan was born and raised. He received his bachelor's degree in Government and Business from The University of Texas at Austin.

# Monday November 6, 2023 Speaker



Roxanne Babin grew up in Beaumont and graduated from Forest Park High School. During her teenage years, she was a member of the Beaumont Melody Maids traveling with Department of Defense entertainment tours to all US military bases around the world.

After graduating from Lamar University, Roxanne joined the company of the Windmill Dinner Theatre in Houston. She married Brian Babin in 1972 and together they sang professionally to finance his dental school education. They had a surprise addition to the family during Brian's Junior year of dental school and another surprise addition his Senior year, prompting them to accept an USAF scholarship which obligated them to 4 years of military service. Returning to TX in the summer of 1979 after serving in Ramstein Germany, the Babins welcomed planned baby #3, along with surprise baby #4. With four children under the age of 5, they settled close to family in the small town of Woodville. Brian became the local dentist, mayor, school board member and Baptist deacon while Roxanne drove the carpool, did the laundry, cooked the supper, fed the dog, and 9 years later welcomed BIG surprise, baby #5.

As a resident of Woodville for 40 years, Roxanne and her husband, Congressman Brian Babin, helped grow the area GOP from no Republican primary in 1980 to a full county slate of Republican office holders today. Roxanne has written, directed, and performed in the Tyler County Dogwood Pageant historical dramas, served in the Music and Performing Arts ministry of First Baptist Church and as a Director of the Heritage Village Museum where she established a state award winning Junior Historian program. In Washington D.C., Roxanne has served as the Program Chairman of the Republican Congressional Spouses' Club, the Vice-Chair of the Republican Speakers' Seminar, the Vice President of the International Friendship Club, a Director of the Republican Women's Federal Forum and a member of the Candy Carson Voices and Strings Ensemble performing annually at area military hospitals and the Museum of the Bible.

Roxanne has been a classroom teacher, mostly in the Middle School grades, which she credits as preparation for facing any situation she might encounter in Washington. She takes an active interest in the Congressional Military Academy appointment process, The Student Congressional Advisory Council, The Congressional Art Contest, and local and D.C. office internships. Roxanne takes seriously the responsibility of expanding the educational opportunities available to area students throughout the Texas 36th Congressional District to nurture our next generation of Republican leaders. Roxanne thought she and her husband of 50 years would spend their retirement traveling and enjoying their seventeen grandchildren. An unmistakable call to duty in the form of an unexpected Congressional race changed their future in 2014. She went from planning Christmas dinner one day to running a Congressional campaign the next. And she has never looked back.



Kit Whitehill is the 2022-2023 TFRW President. She previously served as the 1st Vice President-Special Events, the Community Engagement Chair, and the 2017 TFRW Convention Chair. She has presented at numerous TFRW Nuts and Bolts Trainings, and at the 2019 NFRW Region III Training held in New Orleans.

Kit has made a great impact on the local level as well, founding the Coppell Republican Women in 2012 and serving as their President three times and Programs Chairman twice. She is a Dallas County precinct chair and served as the Dallas County GOP Secretary for 5 years.

Kit was the Campaign Manager for her husband, Justice Bill Whitehill of the Fifth District Court of Appeals in the 2012 and 2014 elections. In 2014, the Dallas County Republican Party named her a "Volunteer of the Year" and in 2015 the Coppell Republican Women's club was honored to be named the Dallas County GOP Club of Year. She was appointed by Governor Abbott in 2019 to serve on the Texas Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority.

Kit and her husband Justice Bill Whitehill have been married 42 years. They have three children and five grandchildren. They have lived in Coppell since 1993 and are active members at Valley Ranch Baptist Church

#### TEXAS SUPREME COURT JUSTICE JANE BLAND Place 6



Jane Bland has served in the state judiciary for 25 years and on the Supreme Court of Texas since 2019. Before her service on the Court, she served 15 years as a justice on the First Court of Appeals and six years as a State District Judge.

Justice Bland chairs the Judicial Commission on Mental Health. She is also the Court's liaison to the Texas Board of Legal Specialization and the Texas Supreme Court Historical Society. She is the deputy liaison to the Court's Rules Advisory Committee. She is a member of the American Law Institute and serves on the Advisory Committee for the Federal Civil Rules for the Judicial Conference of the United States.

Throughout her career, Justice Bland has been recognized for her work to improve our state's judiciary. In 2010, Chief Justice John Roberts presented her with the William H. Rehnquist Award, given to a state court judge who exemplifies the highest level of judicial excellence, integrity, fairness, and professional ethics. The Texas Association of Civil Trial and Appellate Specialists has recognized her as the judge of the year four times. She has received several President's Awards for her work with the Houston Bar Association and the Houston Young Lawyers Association. Justice Bland is board certified in civil appellate law and civil trial law.

She earned her undergraduate and law degrees from the University of Texas at Austin. Following law school, Justice Bland clerked for the Honorable Thomas Gibbs Gee on the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit. She began her practice at Baker Botts LLP. Before her appointment to the Court, she was a partner at Vinson & Elkins LLP in Houston.

Justice Bland has chaired the board of Houston Volunteer Lawyers and the Oversight Committee for the Texas Pattern Jury Charges. She served on the Court's Commission to Expand Civil Legal Services and the Board of Legal Specialization's Civil Appellate Law Advisory Commission. She is a senior trustee of the UT Law School Foundation.

Justice Bland and her husband, Doug, have two grown children.

ROAR Louder Program Component	What is expected of the volunteer?	Which grade levels are participating?
Traditional ROAR	Volunteer to read at least once per week for 30 minutes with the same student.	Students will be selected from grades 2 – 5
Classroom ROAR	For those with busy schedules, volunteer to visit a classroom to read aloud a book to students. This can be done multiple times during the school year, if desired. The book will be provided for you.	Classrooms in K – 5 will be selected





We Mourn the Loss of Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, 1930-2023

On December 1, American women lost a true trail-blazer and role model - Justice Sandra Day O'Connor. Most recognize O'Connor as the first woman to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court. But did you know she was a member of the National Federation of Republican Women before she became a judge?

O'Connor graduated from Stanford Law School at a time when few women were pursuing legal careers; in fact, despite being on law review and third in her class, she could get hired only as a legal secretary, not a lawyer.

She went on to pursue a career in politics that included five years in the Arizona State Senate. In 1972 she broke a glass ceiling when she became Majority Leader - the first woman in the country to hold such a high office in a state legislative body.

Sandra Day O'Connor shattered the hardest of ceilings in 1981, when President Ronald Reagan appointed her to the Supreme Court. She was confirmed 99-0. Describing his nominee as "a new Justice for a new American era" at the National Federation of Republican Women Biennial Convention in Denver on September 18, 1981, President Reagan said:

"One accomplishment that I'm especially proud of as President is the appointment to the Supreme Court of Sandra O'Connor. She is an outstanding example of the qualified women living all across this country whose talents and energies are so helpful in Washington. And let me say that one of her good qualities is the fact that she was a member of this organization before she joined the bench... And I'm convinced she'll make a fine Justice, not just because she's the first woman on the Court but she also brings, as I say, a philosophy with her that I believe is especially appropriate for the Court."



# Men Do Not Belong in Women's Sports. Period.


NFRW, President Eileen Sobjack joined over 17 organizations and many individuals with collegiate swimmer Riley Gaines in a rally to support women's sports. The fight continues.

This Wednesday, Gaines testified before the House Oversight Subcommittee on Health Care and Financial Services on the Biden Administration's proposed changes to Title IX, which expand the definition of sexual discrimination to include gender identity. When the subcommittee's ranking Democrat, Summer Lee, called Gaines' remarks "transphobic," Gaines struck back: "And ranking member Lee, if my testimony makes me 'transphobic,' then I believe your opening monologue makes you a misogynist." Subcommittee Chairwoman Lisa McClain called out the Biden Administration for putting leftist politics before women and girls, "Congress must do everything it can to protect women's sports," she said, charging, "The Biden Administration is putting women's safety, privacy, and opportunities at risk by dismantling Title IX."
