Congressman Randy Weber

Randy is a third-generation Texan who has called the Gulf Coast home for nearly 70 years. He has lived in a 20-mile radius his entire life. He is a graduate of Ross Sterling High School, Alvin Community College, and the University of Houston Clear Lake.

As a small business owner, Weber built his air conditioning company on a strong work ethic and common sense, which he learned from watching his father own his business. For 35 years, Weber owned and operated Weber's Air and Heat. Any Texan knows the importance of AC in the summertime. Most importantly, they know the importance of a reliable repairman.

In 2008, Weber was elected to the Texas State House where he proudly represented District 29. While serving you in Austin, Mr. Weber served on the Border and Intergovernmental Affairs Committee, Environmental Regulation Committee, and the Public Education Committee. While in the State House he authored landmark legislation that created a statewide human trafficking prevention task force, provided additional training to law enforcement, and provided legal protections to minor victims.

In 2013, Randy Weber was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives to serve Texas' Fourteenth Congressional District. Since taking office, Weber has brought Texas pride and conservative values to Congress and worked tirelessly to ensure your voice is heard and fight to uphold the Constitution. In Congress, he serves on the powerful Energy and Commerce Committee, which is vested with the broadest jurisdiction of any congressional authorizing committee. 2023 in review with Texas House Speaker Dade Phelan

As we approach the end of a marathon year for the 88th Texas Legislature, Southeast Texans can rest assured that the future of our region is more promising than ever. Through a 140-day regular session followed by four special sessions, I had the honor of leading the Texas House on historic measures that will strengthen our growing state and allow our local communities to thrive.

Texas' standout economic success has come with rising local property taxes, but this summer lawmakers delivered \$18 billion in historic property tax relief statewide. As the largest tax cut in Texas history, homestead owners will receive an average of \$1,260-\$1,460 in tax relief per year, while non-homestead owners will also see the benefits of school district rate compression and new protections on appraisal increases.

The Texas House also laid the groundwork to continue attracting companies to relocate or expand in our state through new economic incentive tools that will encourage job creation and investments in Texas communities.

Here in House District 21, I've worked to ensure our local workforce is equipped with the tools needed for the Southeast Texas economy through a number of initiatives in higher education. While enrollment is decreasing at other institutions of higher education, here in the Golden Triangle enrollment is soaring. Tuition at these institutions has also been reduced by 50% since 2019.

Recent highlights of our state budget include \$25.5 million for disaster mitigation and renovation for Lamar Institutions and \$750,000 for Southeast Texas Health and Wellness Outreach at Lamar University, which will support the Gift of Life Cancer Prevention Program in Southeast Texas. The Allied Health Professionals Program at Lamar State College Port Arthur received \$1.9 million to increase capacity and enhance current programs imparting advanced skills for the healthcare field. Lamar University's Petrochemical Chemical Industry Engineering institute received \$10 million to help support our energy and petrochemical industries.

It's no secret Texas is experiencing massive growth, and this year I've worked to ensure our region has the infrastructure to back that expansion. This session, we achieved historic funding for our ports to keep our local economy thriving with \$200 million to the Texas Department of Transportation for port capital improvement projects and \$400 for the Ship Channel Improvement Revolving Loan Program.

Southeast Texans know flood prevention and our water supply are paramount, especially during hurricane season. This year, the Texas Legislature dedicated \$1 billion to the Texas Water Fund to finance water projects in Texas, as well as \$625 million to be transferred to the Flood Infrastructure Fund, which will increase funding for flood control, drainage and mitigation projects.

Lawmakers have worked tirelessly to bolster the reliability of Texas' power grid, and I made sure this session that \$1 billion of a \$10 billion program for resiliency and reliability project grants, facility modernization and weatherization went to non-ERCOT utilities to help our region to prepare for hurricane season while reducing the burden on local ratepayers.

Other key infrastructure wins this year include \$1 billion for broadband expansion and improvement to increase educational and work opportunities in rural areas and \$5 billion for construction, maintenance and improvement of Texas highways.

Maintaining a high quality of life has been a priority of mine as our state grows and advances. Our region has worked for decades to expand access to mental health care, and I'm proud to have led the effort to allocate \$64 million for a new outpatient integrated behavioral health clinic, with 72 new inpatient mental health beds at Baptist Hospitals of Southeast Texas. Our state budget also dedicates \$9.4 billion toward mental health at existing facilities in addition to building new ones, as well as almost \$450 million for women's health programs and more than \$178 million for rural hospitals.

These successes have corresponded with statewide efforts to ensure the safety of Texas communities. Lawmakers recently secured \$1.54 billion for our state's historic border wall in addition to the \$5.1 billion invested in heightened border security initiatives from the regular session. We've also enhanced accountability standards for District Attorneys who fail to sufficiently defend Texas law.

Protecting our next generation of Texans is one of the most important jobs we as lawmakers undertake. This year, we enacted improved school safety requirements and protocols for public schools and worked to safeguard the innocence of childhood by banning radical gender modification procedures and medications for minors and exposure to inappropriate content in school libraries.

Returning home after an extended period in Austin away from my family and my community, I'm extremely proud of the significant accomplishments I led the Texas House on this year that secure a bright future for our state, and especially Southeast Texas.
